If Organics bin or cart is not available at your complex, please place the following items in the trash.



### Yard Trimmings

Grass Clippings, Leaves, Flowers, Wood Branches & Untreated Lumber



### Food Scraps

Vegetables, Fruit, Egg Shells, Meat, Shellfish, Bones, Cereal



### Food-Soiled Paper

Greasy Pizza Boxes, Paper Towels, Paper To-Go Containers (wax-coated only), Coffee Grounds and Filters, Tea Bags, Food-Soiled Paper, Coffee Grounds

Please do not place plastic or foil-coated paper or plastic wrap of any kind in Organics cart/bin.

# HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)

**Keep hazardous waste out of trash, recycling and green waste containers.**

Without knowing it, everyone purchases household products that have the potential to be dangerous. These common products include paints, household cleaners, garden products, detergents, pet care products, batteries, lamps, and other such materials. **It is illegal to dispose of HHW in trash.** HHW should be taken to a HHW facility for proper disposal.

Ask your landlord or property manager about Waste Management’s “At Your Door Special Collection” Program which provides property owners appointment-based collection of household hazardous waste. Or, you can take your household hazardous waste to the Yolo County Landfill for free disposal on Friday or Saturday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 pm. ## Household Hazardous Waste includes:

- Garden products: pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, & sprays
- Paints
- Household cleaners
- Auto products
- Propane tanks, fire extinguishers
- Photo & pool chemicals
- Fluorescent lamps & bulbs, thermostats & other items containing mercury
- Batteries
- Sharps/Needles
- Electronics

## Hazardous Waste NOT Accepted at HHW Facility includes:

Asbestos • Treated Wood • Sewage • Explosives • Ammunition • Radioactive Materials • Pharmaceutical Waste • Infectious Materials & Medical Waste (except sharps) • Compressed Gas Cylinders (except propane tanks, fire extinguishers and aerosols)

## BULKY ITEM DISPOSAL



Need to get rid of your old couch? Have some old furniture you want to get rid of before moving? Ask your landlord or property manager about Waste Management’s free bulky curbside pickup services. Residential property owners throughout West Sacramento are eligible for two (2) bulky waste collection appointments per year (July - June). Eligible items include furniture, mattresses/box springs, electronics, tires (limit 4), small and large appliances, rugs, etc. Limits apply. Ask your landlord or property manager to contact Waste Management to set up a collection at your building.

## COLLECTING ORGANICS



Use a reusable container to collect food scraps and dump the scraps into your organics cart. You can also place scraps in a paper bag or ASTM D6400 rated compostable bags and throw it all in your organics cart.
